They represent the only atoll that Charles Darwin visited and became central to his theory of coral reef development, and have played a central role in several subsequent debates ...

Cocos Keeling Islands "officially" becomes an Australian Territory; Australian Government establishes a permanent presence on West Island. 1978 The Australian Government purchases all of the Clunies-Ross land on Cocos Islands for Australian \$6.25 million, less lot 14 (Home Island) and 5 hectares surrounding it.

John Clunies-Ross, [9] who sailed there in the Borneo in 1825, called the group the Borneo Coral Isles,

restricting Keeling to North Keeling, and calling South Keeling “the Cocos properly so called”.
