Frazer Solar is developing a large-scale solar-storage project for IPP investor, owner and operator Frazium Energy. Phase 1 of the development involves solar PV coupled with battery storage to provide 200 MWH of dispatchable baseload electricity per day.

The contract allows FZM to operate the large scale solar-storage IPP project in Eswatini for 40 years. In return, FZM will invest \$116.5 million over the next five years for the first phase of the project. The ...

The solar farm is under development by Frazium Energy, a subsidiary of the Frazer Solar Group, an Australian-German conglomerate. The energy off-taker is Eswatini Electricity Company (EEC), the national electricity utility parastatal company, under a 40-year power purchase agreement
