Who pays for the underwater tunnels in the Faroe Islands?

What makes the Faroe Islands unique?

Nestled in the wild North Atlantic Ocean, the Faroe Islands are a mountainous archipelago with unimaginable beauty. The 18 islands are separated by deep fjords and many villages hidden behind steep mountains. These conditions have made tunnels essential for connecting the islanders together.

Where to go in the Faroe Islands?

You will enter Sandoy Island near Lake Sandavatn which is one of the most beautiful lakes in the Faroe islands. There are four sub-sea tunnels in the Faroe Islands. Norðoyatunnilin links Eysturoy Island to Borðoy Island. The sub-sea tunnel is 6.2 km (3.8 miles) long.

Where is the tunnel portal in the Faroe Islands?

The tunnel portal is located on the western side of Streymoy Island at Gamlarætt Ferry Port. You will enter Sandoy Island near Lake Sandavatn which is one of the most beautiful lakes in the Faroe islands. There are four sub-sea tunnels in the Faroe Islands. Norðoyatunnilin links Eysturoy Island to Borðoy Island.

How do I get to the Faroe Islands?

All travellers coming to the Faroe Islands by flight will drive through this tunnel as the only airport in the Faroe Islands is located on Vágar Island. Once you get to the Streymoy Island side of the tunnel, you are super close to the lovely Lake Leynavatn. Some mountain tunnels have only one lane.

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The power sockets on the Faroe Islands are of type F and K. The standard voltage is 230 V at a frequency of 50 Hz. You need a power plug (travel) adapter on the Faroe Islands.

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Outlets in the Faroe Islands. Off to the Faroe Islands, with their dramatic landscapes? They use type C and K outlets, not the standard US ones. Make sure a travel adapter is in your bag.
