Are solar panels a scam?

That is, of course, also a scam. To protect yourself from clean energy scams: Know that "free" or "no cost" solar panel offers are scams. The federal government does not install solar systems in homes for free. Are 'free solar panel health checks' a scam?

We're regularly contacted by customers, who have received an unsolicited call or letter from another company, offering them a 'free solar panel health check' or warning about their solar PV system being at risk of failing. This is a common scam.

Can you get free solar panels on a roof?

Companies offered to pay to lease your roof from you for 20-25 years and, in exchange, would install and maintain solar PV panels on it. You didn't have to pay upfront for the panels, and would also benefit from the free electricity produced by the system. But there are very few free solar panel schemes available now.

Are 'fake' solar companies a scam?

Beware of any company asking you to make a big deposit before they have completed their installation. This is one of the most common ways 'fake' solar companies have targeted consumers - whereby they take a hefty deposit and then never turn up to carry out the installation. This is common solar scam.

What if I signed up for free solar panels?

If you signed up for free solar panels when the FIT rate was at its highest, back in 2011, we calculated that you could miss out on as much as £23,000 for a 4kWp system. You would also have saved more than £5,000 over 25 years from the electricity produced by the panels.

What should I do if a solar business is a scam?

Protect your personal information. Don't respond to unexpected requests online or on social media for your name, address, or other personal information to "see if you qualify." At best, this is someone generating leads to sell, not actual solar businesses. At worst, they're scammers trying to steal your identity.
